

## List of things to bring:

- ✓ Handheld GPS (unit if you have one)
- ✓ Garmin Astro dog collar (if you have one)
- ✓ Polaris Ranger/Kawasaki Mule, etc.
- ✓ Snake protection (leggings, chaps, boots)
- ✓ Camera
- ✓ Dog supplies
- ✓ Refreshments (for in the field and after the hunt)

Courtesy of Garmin Int'l., we will have on hand 20 of the Astro 220 GPS units for use during the exercise.

A liability release is attached and must be completed and returned upon arrival. Snake protection is required at ALL times afield (we have extra snake leggings if you need a pair) and rattlesnake vaccinations are encouraged for your dogs. Some sandburs occur throughout the Ranch, and some pastures have them pretty bad in spots, so bring along dog boots if you have them. The RPQRR is not well watered, so bring a water dish and a container to carry dog water to the field.

While the RPQRR is surrounded by netwire fence, it is certainly NOT dog-proof, and the north side of the highway is adjacent to US 180 which has moderate traffic activity.
